

Baked Chicken Tacos Cont.

Spoon 1 TBSP of beans into the bottom of each shell. Top with the chicken mixture, almost to the top of each shell.

Sprinkle each shell generously with shredded cheese. Bake for 7-10 minutes or until cheese is fully melted and the edges of the shells are browned

Remove from oven and top with favorite items.

NOTE: Be sure to drain tomatoes completely. This will help keep the taco shells from getting soggy while baking. You can use any kind of chicken. Thighs have a good flavor but more fat than breast. Rotisserie chicken can be used as well.

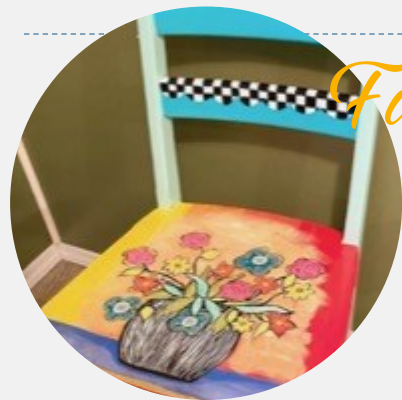
Easy Hacks for Happy Houseplants

Almost time to bring in those houseplants that have been enjoying the outdoors. They are lush and happy and you need some help keeping them alive and thriving, right? Well here you go!



- 1 Use wine bottles to water plants. Most of us are over/under-waterers. Fill with water up to base of neck; cover opening with thumb, turn bottle upside down and quickly insert neck into the soil. Over time, water will release to hydrate the plant.
- 2 Use banana peels to dust leaves. About once a month treat your waxy plants to your morning banana. Rub the inside of the peel along the leaves to pick up dust and make the leaves nice and shiny so they can absorb light.
- 3 Use wooden chopsticks to check hydration. Push the chopstick deep into the soil. If it comes out clean, it's time to water. Dirt clinging? Don't water. Do this check once or twice a week. Giant plant - use a dowel rod.
- 4 Use egg shells to fertilize the soil. Egg shells are rich in calcium, phosphorus and magnesium all of which plants love. Rinse the shells, set aside to dry; when dry, store in an airtight container. When you have a small collection (18 +/- eggs' worth) grind them into a fine powder and sprinkle on top of the soil around the base of your plant.

“When he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth.” (John 16:13) The Holy Spirit is so identified with the Bible, one of His names is Truth! In fact, Peter reveals that the Holy Spirit is the inspirational Author of the Old Testament Scriptures. Faith Fryman



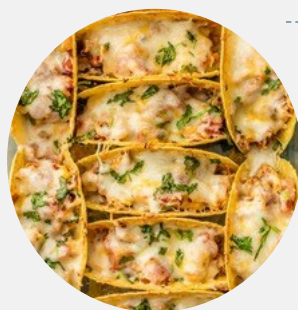
Faith was born in Michigan, the youngest of 6. After college she was a kindergarten teacher and also a teacher for challenged children. In her 50’s she made a career change and became an RN! Plus a minister’s wife for 30 years. Faith and Lawrence have 2 children, 5

grands and 3 greats! Daughter and son-in-law Becky and Jeff Boyce brought them to Lakeview after they moved here from North Carolina. Did you know Faith went to a one-room country school until 7th grade and she’s written and published a book about her family.

Want to know what kind of heart Faith has? When I asked her what book she’s read lately, this was her answer: “I shared a book that I’ve had on my shelf for a long time with a friend’s daughter who had a miscarriage and was grieving... I reread parts of it to be sure it was appropriate for this situation. After having 3 miscarriages myself I understand that kind of grieving.” Isn’t that the kind of woman you want coming alongside you when you struggle with life?

Diagnosed with lung cancer last year, she said she is learning to lean on God and trust Him for all her needs even when she can’t see what the future will be. (We continue to pray for Faith as she currently deals with chemo and radiation for new spots.)

Her prayer for Lakeview women: “To seek more of Jesus. When times get tough, pray more and stay in the Word. Trust in His promises. Turn to Him for comfort and for wisdom. Witness to others of His goodness. Learn the old hymn ‘What a Friend We Have in Jesus’ and hang on tight!”

Baked Chicken Tacos

Whip up these easy and delicious tacos that are sure to be a winner!

- 1 TBSP Olive oil
- ½ lb cooked chicken, chopped
- 1 Pkg taco seasoning
- ½ C diced onion (I used green onions)
- 1 can diced tomatoes, fully drained
- 1 can chopped green chilis
- 10 Stand and stuff Taco shells
- 8 oz refried beans (1/2 can)
- 2 C Mexican blend cheese, shredded

Toppings: jalapenos, sour cream, salsa, chopped cilantro, shredded lettuce, etc

Preheat oven to 400.

Spray a 9x13 baking dish with nonstick spray

In a medium sized skillet heat olive oil over medium heat.

Add onion to skillet and cook for 2-3 minutes or until onion is translucent but not browned.

Stir in the cooked chicken, taco seasoning, tomatoes (fully drained) and green chilis. Stir to combine.

Reduce to simmer and allow to cook for 5-8 min.

Place the taco shells in the baking dish standing up. Bake taco shells for 5 minutes by themselves to allow them to crisp up. Remove from oven.
